As many of you know I had surgery on March 11th to repair an umbilical hernia. When I first discovered it, I had no idea what it was. Just a small squishy spot just inside my belly button. I didn't really think much about it, I figured it was a sign that I should begin to lose some weight! The doctor assured me that while I still might want to consider losing a few pounds, the spot in my belly button was unrelated. The good news was it could be repaired with surgery.

It didn't need to be a high priority, but it did need to get fixed before it became a bigger issue or an emergency. So a consultation was scheduled with the surgeon and a date was set for surgery. As the day drew closer I could feel my anxiety increase. In my thirty plus years in ministry I have been there with countless people as they were prepped for surgery. But I have not been the person BEING prepped for surgery. This would be the first surgery I would be intubated and deeply anesthetized and someone I just met a few weeks ago would be cutting me open.

There were so many moments that touched my heart and soul leading up to and even after surgery. My co-worker and friend, Chad picked me up and prayer with me on the way to the hospital. What a calming moment for me. The text messages, phone calls, meal deliveries and cards from my church family meant so much to me. What a difference it makes to know there are people who care about you.

I was reminded in very real ways of the power of prayer to bring peace when the mind is racing. I was reminded in very real ways of the power of a simple phone call, a gesture as easy as sending a card or a text message to assure you someone cares. I was reminded in very real ways that the ministry of caring for one another, loving one another as Christ first loved us doesn't have to be complicated. It just needs to be real. Thank you all for the caring so much and sharing the love of Christ in so many real ways.

First Christian Church of Bowling Green, OH - Board Meeting, February 8, 2024

The February 8,2024 board meeting of First Christian Church was held at the church and via Zoom. Present: Earlene Kilpatrick, presiding; Pastor Gene Sugg and members, Jim and Karen Adams, Nancy Andrade, Sharon Daniels, Jay Kirkbride, Ruth Ann McCray, Steve Riewaldt, Char Scherer; Kim Thomas, Rae Thomson, Elizabeth Wick and Pat Koehler.

The meeting was called to order at 7:04 by Moderator Earlene Kilpatrick who opened with prayer.

The devotion was given by Sharon Daniels from A Gift of Angels. Angels are referred to 294 times in the Bible and serve humans as guardians, messengers, instruments of praise and worship to God, created by God for his service. The March devotion will be given by Earlene.

The January 11, 2024 board minutes were amended to note that 'Study' information appeared under the topic of 'Women's Group'. It was corrected to read <u>Study:</u> Women's Spiritual Study Group will be on hold due to Don Scherer's illness. The minutes were approved as amended on a motion made by Kim Thomas, second by Rae Thomson.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Jim Adams' who provided an amended report for December to reflect year-end changes. He noted that 2023 was a good year. January was flat reflecting expenses. The report was accepted into the minutes. He also provided a Finance Committee report. They are looking to move from check writing to electronic usage and establish a money market deposit account that would earn interest with little risk. It was noted that the Capital Fund has reached \$26,000 of the \$30,000 goal.

Administrative:

Clerk: Sharon Daniels reported Don Scherer's passing on January 15.

<u>Personnel:</u> Earlene reported that the committee is working on contract renewals for Lee and Pastor Gene. Nano's contract will end the last of April; she has recommended another music student to replace her who is available to begin in August. It will be necessary to make music arrangements for the summer months.

<u>Property:</u> Steve Riewaldt reported that alarms have been installed to protect the property by detecting any smoke or water leakage. The committee will be working with Scott Beeker for plans for the summer mowing.

<u>Technology:</u> Jay Kirkbride reported they are still working on the email problem, ways to get the video camera out of the aisle, and streaming issues solved. Gene will assist in getting the website back up. Char asked to be kept in the loop.

FCC Constitution and By-laws: Chair Diane Morlock is dealing with health issues and will be working on an update as she is able.

Moderator: Earlene and Gene will be working on organizing the Pastoral Relations Committee and planning for Gene's Installation Service on February 25. Betsy Solley has Hospitality Committee members working on the event in her absence. Earlene also mentioned that Bosdorff's Greenhouse will no longer be providing poinsettias or Easter lilies so a new source will have to be found.

<u>Pastor's Comments:</u> Gene reflected on his past weekend spent with longtime friends in Cincinnati and how important it is to share love with each other. A challenge to the church is to love even those whom we disagree with. He recounted the Fruits of the Spirit from Galatians and spoke to the importance of living by the Spirit in love and joy and avoiding walls and words that hurt.

Old Business:

The Ash Wednesday service will be streamed.

Pastor Gene's Installation will be part of the worship service on February 25 with Rev. Allen Harris preaching. It will be followed by a potluck luncheon.

Karen Adams will be a new member of the Worship Planning Committee

<u>New Business:</u>

Steve Riewaldt made a motion that we close off church property during the Solar Eclipse on April 8 to protect our lawn and property. Jay Kirkbride seconded. The motion passed following discussion with one abstention.

Steve also brought forward the issue of the parsonage rental. Following discussion, the issue was tabled until the March board meeting. Property Committee will get information from Almar Property Management and present recommendations for consideration.
