That call and response is my favorite part of the Easter Sunday celebration. Ever since I was a young kid it's been a part of my Easter Sunday worship traditions and I love keeping that tradition alive. Doing so not only keeps me connected to my past and the people who helped formed me but also brings that connection to the present. It isn't always easy to stay connected to others, not as much as we would like.

In today's fast-paced, digital world, it is easier to feel connected and at the same time still feel deeply alone. We spend so much time on social media. According to recent studies, on average, people spend about 2 hours and 24 minutes daily on social media platforms. This translates to roughly 143 minutes per day. However, this average can vary based on factors like age, gender, and location. We spend time scrolling, posting, sharing, liking, but do we truly connect?

As followers of Christ, we are called not just to know about one another, but to know one another—to bear each other's burdens, rejoice together, and walk hand in hand through life's joys and trials.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 states: "Two are better than one... If either of them falls down, one can help the other up." God designed us for community. Jesus Himself modeled intimate connection with His disciples, sharing meals, praying together, and engaging in honest conversation.

Personal connections are the heartbeat of a healthy church. When we share our lives with one another - beyond Sunday greetings - we create space for healing, encouragement, and transformation. Whether it's a kind word in the hallway, a meal delivered during hard times, or a small group that meets regularly for prayer, every act of intentional connection builds up the body of Christ.

Sharing our joys and triumphs with people who care solidifies the connections. Our brains are wired for connection. Studies have actually shown that strong social ties are linked to better mental and physical health. Feeling connected can boost your mood, reduce stress, and even make you live longer!

So, how do we keep those connections strong when life gets crazy? It doesn't have to be anything extravagant. A quick text, a phone call while you're waiting in line, meeting up for coffee, or even just a heartfelt comment on a social media post can make a difference. It's about showing people you're thinking of them and making a little effort to stay in touch.

Here are a few thoughts to consider when trying to make time for connecting. It's easy to let quality time with loved ones slip away. Even small, intentional moments — a shared meal, a walk together, a heartfelt conversation – can make a big difference.

- Practice active listening: Truly hearing and understanding the hearts of those we love strengthens our connection and fosters empathy.
- Offer grace and forgiveness: We are all imperfect, and misunderstandings are inevitable. Extending grace and practicing forgiveness allows love to flourish.
- Celebrate the small victories: Acknowledge and appreciate the everyday moments of joy and support within the family. These celebrations reinforce positive connections. We are here to support one another, offering encouragement, prayer, and a sense of belonging.

First Christian Church of Bowling Green, OH - Board Meeting, March 13, 2025

The March 13, 2025, board meeting of First Christian Church was held at the church and via Zoom. Present: Pastor Gene Sugg, Vice Moderator Earlene Kilpatrick, presiding, and members, Sharon Daniels, Jay Kirkbride, Pat Koehler, Ruth Maltby, Diane and Ron Morlock, Steve Riewaldt, Barb and Gary Spencer, and Elizabeth Wick.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Earlene Kilpatrick, who opened with prayer.

Pat's devotion was read by Diane about the joy of living intentionally. April's devotion will be given by Ruth.

Administration:

Approval: The February 13 board minutes were approved on a motion by Gary, second by Ron.

<u>Clerk</u>: There was a question as to the membership status of Marge George, who recently died, Diane suggested that it would be helpful to have an updated church membership list. Sharon will work with Lee to add a field in the Excel Database that would identify those listed as active, inactive and participating members.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Earlene pointed to the high expenditures in February on the Profit and Loss report including building maintenance, snow and ice removal and parsonage real estate taxes. The reports were accepted into the minutes.

<u>Finance Committee Report</u>: Committee has recommended that the church switch to the Servant Keeper software program in early April to reduce expenses. The next meeting is April 8 at 5 pm.

<u>Property</u>: Steve reported that a water mitigation process after the broken water pipeline in the church offices is completed including work by Guarantee Carpet. The committee agreed to eliminate the stripping and waxing project to apply money to payments incurred. Steve is exploring the possibility of FCC hosting a Boy Scout and/or Cub Scout group next year. Options will be explored and more discussion will be held.

<u>Technology</u>: Jay reported that the hard drive on the office computer is being expanded and will give Lee the ability to assist with the power point for worship.

Personnel: No report.

Pastor: Gene discussed the Pastoral Relations Committee that he is establishing. This committee would function as a liaison, providing open and positive dialogue with the congregation and would include 4-5 church members. Diane Morlock and Ruth Maltby have offered to serve. He led the Ash Wednesday service and has started a Lenten study group that is meeting on Wednesday evenings at the church and via zoom, and is entitled 'Living the Questions'. He will be officiating at Marge George's funeral service on March 22; Diane will assist with music. He reported on recent activities, attending the Care Elder meeting and the Wauseon Rally, announcing that it will be held in BG next year. Lilly Dowd and Geoff Roberts will be baptized on Palm Sunday.

Old Business:

FCC Constitution and Bylaws: Diane presented a review of the proposed revision of the FCC Constitution with a report of changes and reasoning. Members working on the project for the past few years included Elizabeth Wick, Jim Adams, Claude and Earlene Kilpatrick and committee chair, Diane Morlock. Pastor Sugg served as Ex-officio. She explained that the Constitution needs to be approved and in place before work can begin on the By-Laws. With suggested minor changes to be made, the motion on the table as presented by the committee was approved by the board. The final document will be presented to the congregation for approval by a two-thirds vote at a special meeting after Easter. Notice of the meeting will be sent to the congregation by Lee two weeks prior.

Earlene thanked Diane and her committee for their work on this project.

<u>Strategic Planning</u>: Tabled indefinitely. Diane suggested that we should be making an effort to move this project forward with a plan for one to three years. She volunteered to serve on the committee. Earlene will contact Regional Pastor Allen Harris to schedule a meeting. Pastor Gene recommended a committee of five members including a recent new member.

The Shepherding list has been updated to include new members and those who have been attending and they will be preparing 'final weeks care packages' in April for our three BGSU students.

They will be serving a family chicken dinner on Mother's Day, May 11. The Morlocks will provide the cake.

<u>Women's Group</u>: Earlene noted that the rummage sale will be on July 19 and the storage room is available for donations. Their meetings will be the second Tuesday of the month at 4 pm.

FCC Community Meal: Dave Donley and Karen Wood will be in charge of the March 14 meal.

BG Christian Food Pantry: No Report. It was noted that they need help with this mission.

BG Schools Mission Project: Elizabeth delivered items today and they are grateful for the gifts.

Transportation: No requests, no report

Green Team/Green Chalice: No report. Rachel Perez is donating containers for Community meal.

Christian Education: Pastor Gene is conducting a Lenten study on Wednesdays at 7 pm

Women's Spiritual Study Group: Char reports that The Final Days study is very impactful.
