If you would like to help with this ministry, we would love to put you on our list of willing drivers.



FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH OF BOWLING GREEN, OH BOARD MEETING, June 9, 2022

The June 9, 2022 board meeting of First Christian Church was held via zoom. Present: Rev. Gene Sugg, Moderator Earlene Kilpatrick, Members Nancy Andrade, Scott and DeAnna Beeker, Sharon Daniels, Jay Kirkbride, Steve Riewaldt, Mike and Betsy Solley, Elizabeth Wick and Pat Koehler. Incoming board members, Karen and Jim Adams and Kim Thomas were also in attendance.

The call to order and opening prayer was given by Moderator Earlene Kilpatrick at 7:35. The May 12 board meeting minutes were corrected to identify Becky Meredith in the Clerk's report as standing for reaffirmation. The minutes were approved as corrected on a motion by DeAnna Beeker, second by Mike Solley. All yes.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> was given by DeAnna Beeker. Income to date is \$49,336.46 and expenses are \$42,959.38. Total Huntington Bank checking balance is \$72,466.93. The current year Balance Sheet as of May 31 has been provided to members. The report was accepted as presented.

Administrative:

Clerk: Sharon Daniels reported that Karson and Kyle Kirby were baptized on June 5.

Finance Trustees: No report. The committee is planning to meet in the next few weeks for a transition session with Jim Adams coming in as the new Treasurer. The church credit card is currently in Deanna's name

Personnel: Diane Morlock reported to Earlene that personnel committee will be meeting with Pastor Sugg on Monday.

<u>Property</u>: The committee will have insulation installed in the parsonage on June 22, are taking care of leaks in the pastor's office and have purchased a memorial tree for Virgil Frost that will be planted along the driveway. They are planning a service and will erect a plaque in Virgil's memory.

<u>Technology</u>: Jay reported that everything is going well; they continue to look for new team members.

Moderator: Earlene's report will be included in old and new business items.

Pastor's Report:

Gene's devotion pointed to a photo of the beautiful double rainbow last evening and he spoke to 'what makes a rainbow'. The mixture of sunlight and rain creates something wonderful and serves as a metaphor for the mixture of people in a church that also work together for good. He commented on the worship service Sunday that was filled with the blessing of the Kirby's baptism, Kathy Rupp at the organ and Ruth Maltby's beautiful song. A joyous Pentecost service! Gene is planning to have more discussion at the Father's Day luncheon on moving forward toward a settled pastor.

Ministry/Elder's Reports:

<u>Care Elders</u>: Elizabeth reported that Nancy Otley is healing from her broken arm. The Care Elder's will meet next Tuesday and she will present a letter for review to send to those who have not been coming to church. Thank you letters will be sent to Kathy and Ruth; a personal letter to each by Gene and another from the congregation that Pat will send.

Worship Elders: No report or meeting date scheduled.

Fellowship:

<u>Hospitality</u>: Betsy Solley reported that they are exploring bamboo products for use at community dinners as suggested by Rachel Perez; much better environmentally but more expensive. They will continue to compare sizes and prices; Betsy asked if there might be assistance available from other churches involved. Coffee hour is covered for immediate future.

<u>Men's Group</u>: Steve Riewaldt reported that they are planning for the tractor pull parking; they will sponsor Violet Tennison for ChiRho camp and Gene will contact Joanne and arrange a commissioning service. The group is also planning a Homecoming picnic in August

Mission:

Food Pantry: Volunteers are needed on M/W/F during the second week of July. The <u>Community Dinner</u> will be served Friday, June 10, with the Martins in charge.

Old Business:

<u>Amendments</u>: The proposed amendment to our Bylaws for duties of an At-Large Representative and the modification of the Deacon position was published in the June newsletter and will be voted on at a congregational special meeting scheduled for July 3, 2022. <u>Parsonage</u>: Discussion continued on the sale of the parsonage.

<u>Arsonage:</u> Discussion continued on the sale of the parsonage. Concern about the appraisal being low; Steve will consult with a second realtor.

Question of value of a parsonage to an incoming pastor; Gene will contact Allan Harris of Regional Office to get input from potential applicants.

Market and balance sheet concern; consensus that market cooling off, decision sooner than later is advised.

The issue will be further investigated and continues to be tabled until July.

<u>Compensations</u>: Considerable discussion resulted in Jay Kirkbride offering to compensate Quentin Kilpatrick for his months of technology assistance; Organist Kathy Rupp will be paid \$100 for playing on June 5 on motion by Mike Solley, second by Jay Kirkbride.

New Business:

<u>Use of signs</u>: Earlene requested permission to post signs on church property and to promote same on the digital sign for a Woman's Club sale being held at the church. It was noted that the tractor pull and the blood bank events have both been promoted and it is a similar event. <u>Constitution up-date</u>: Earlene will be forming a committee to 'fine-tune' the FCC Constitution and Bylaws in the upcoming Fall. <u>Board Meetings start time</u>: will be changed to 7:00 p.m. beginning in July

<u>Prayer concerns</u>: Prayers were requested for the family of Amber Asmus; Karen Adams' mother, Judy Hartley at Storypoint Senior Living in Waterville, Apt. 23; Elizabeth Wick for safe travels; family of Tom Headley who suffered a stroke; Co-workers of Deanna's, Erica and Judy, Sharon's grand niece Laynee waiting for heart transplant; Earlene's brother, Brian who is near the end of life and friend Sue Clanton with a double mastectomy; and for Gene's granddaughter.

Rev. Gene closed the meeting with prayer.
